CONSTITUTION

Springhill Baptist Church of Fernandina Beach, FL

Preamble

We declare and establish this Constitution to preserve and secure the Principles of our Faith and to the end that this body may be governed in an orderly manner. This Constitution will preserve the liberties of each individual member of Springhill Baptist Church and the Freedom of action of this body in relation to other churches.

Article 1: Name

The name of this church shall be Springhill Baptist Church, Inc.

We believe in Jesus Christ, God's only begotten Son, coequal and coeternal with God ¹, as the Godman born of a virgin ², sinless in His life ³; that He died for our sins, according to the Scriptures, as a substitutionary sacrifice for us ⁴ that all who believe in Him are justified on the grounds of His shed blood and reconciled by His death⁵; that He not only died on the cross for our sins, but that He resurrected bodily for our justification ⁶; that He is now at the right hand of God the Father ⁷, acting as our High Priest ⁸ and our Advocate ⁹ before the Father.

3.5: The Holy Spirit

We believe in the person of the Holy Spirit ¹, coequal and coeternal with God the Father and God the Son ² and who exists in the world today to reveal the fullness of Christ ³, convicting the world of sin, of righteousness, and judgment ⁴, regenerating ⁵, sanctifying ⁶, and sealing forever ⁷ those who have been born again through faith in Jesus Christ ⁸. No one can be saved from sin or be born again or attach himself to the Body of Christ without a supernatural activity of the Holy Spirit in his life. ⁹ Blasphemy of the Holy Spirit is the one unforgiveable sin, because it is the Holy Spirit who testifies of Christ and makes His truth known to us. ¹⁰

3.6: Man

We believe that man was directly and immediately created by God in His image and likeness. Man was created free of sin with a rational nature, intelligence, volition, self-determination, and moral responsibility to God ¹.

We believe that God's intention in the creation of man was that man should glorify God, enjoy God's fellowship, live his life in the will of God, and by this accomplish God's purpose for man in the world ².

We believe that in Adam's sin of disobedience to the revealed will and Word of God, man lost his innocence, incurred the penalty of spiritual and physical death, became subject to the wrath of God, and became inherently corrupt and utterly incapable of choosing or doing that which is acceptable to God apart from divine grace. With no recuperative powers to enable him to recover himself, man is hopelessly lost. Man's salvation is thereby wholly of God's grace through the redemptive work of our Lord Jesus Christ ³.

We believe that, because all men were in Adam, a nature corrupted by Adam's sin has been transmitted to all men of all ages, Jesus Christ being the only exception. All men are thus sinners by nature, by choice, and by divine declaration ⁴.

3.7: Salvation

We believe that salvation is wholly of God by grace on the basis of the redemption of Jesus Christ, the merit of His shed blood, and not on the basis of human merit or works.

3.7.1: Regeneration

We believe that regeneration is a supernatural work of the Holy Spirit by which the divine nature and divine life are given ¹. Regeneration is instantaneous and is accomplished solely by the power of the Holy Spirit through the instrumentality of the Word of God ² when the repentant sinner, as enabled by the Holy Spirit, responds in faith to the divine provision of salvation. Genuine regeneration is manifested by fruits worthy of repentance as demonstrated in righteous attitudes and conduct. Good works are the proper evidence and fruit of regeneration ³, and will be experienced to the extent that the believer submits to the control of the Holy Spirit in his life through faithful obedience to the Word of God ⁴. This obedience causes the believer to be increasingly conformed to the image of our Lord Jesus Christ ⁵. Such a conformity is climaxed in the believer's glorification at Christ's coming ⁶.

3.7.2: Justification

We believe that justification before God is an act of God ¹ by which He declares righteous those who, through faith in Christ, repent of their sins ² and confess Him as sovereign Lord ³. This righteousness is apart from any virtue or work of man ⁴ and involves the imputation of our sins to Christ ⁵ and the imputation of Christ's righteousness to us ⁶. By this means God is enabled to "be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus" ⁷.

3.7.5: Grace

We believe that election¹ is the eternal purpose of God² according to which He graciously regenerates³, sanctifies⁴, and saves sinners⁵. We teach election does not conflict or negate the responsibility of man to repent and trust Christ as Savior and Lord.⁶ It is the most glorious display of God's sovereign goodness⁷, and that He is infinitely wise⁸, holy⁹, and unchangeable¹⁰. It utterly excludes boasting¹¹, and promotes humility, love, prayer, praise, and trust in God. Those whom God has accepted in Christ and sanctified by His Spirit¹² will never fall away from the state of grace, but shall persevere to the end¹³. Believers may fall into sin¹⁴ through neglect and temptation whereby they grieve the Spirit¹⁵, impair their graces, and comforts, and bring reproach on the cause of Christ, and temporal judgment on themselves¹⁶, yet they shall be kept by the power of God through faith unto Salvation.

3.13: The Family

She, being in the image of God as is her husband and thus equal to him, has the God-given responsibility to respect her husband and to serve as his helper in managing the household and nurturing the next generation. Children, from the moment of conception, are a blessing and heritage from the Lord. Parents are to demonstrate to their children God's pattern for marriage. Parents are to teach their children the gospel of Jesus Christ, and to lead them by a consistent lifestyle example and loving discipline, to make choices based on biblical truth. 4. We believe Deacons shall assist the Pastor as they help plan and oversee church ministries and administration.

Our Church Covenant

- 1. Having been led, as we believe, by the Spirit of God, to receive Jesus Christ as the Lord, Savior, and supreme Treasure of our lives, and, on the profession of our faith, having been baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, we do now, in the presence of God, and this assembly, most solemnly and joyfully enter into covenant with one another as one body in Christ.
- 2. We engage, therefore, by the aid of the Holy Spirit, to walk together in Christian love, to strive for the advancement of this Church in knowledge, holiness and peace; to promote its spirituality and fruitfulness; to sustain its worship, ordinances, and discipline; to welcome, and test biblically, instruction from the Scriptures by the leaders of the church, seeking to grow toward Biblical unity in the truth; to contribute cheerfully and regularly to the support of the ministry, the expenses of the Church, the relief of the poor, and the spread of the Gospel through all nations.
- 3. We also engage to maintain family and personal devotions; to educate our children in the Christian faith; to seek the salvation of our kindred and acquaintances; to walk circumspectly in the world; to be just in our dealings, faithful in our engagements, and exemplary in our deportment, to avoid all tattling, backbiting and unrighteous anger; to seek God's help in abstaining from all practices which bring unwarranted harm to the body or jeopardize our own or another's faith.
- 4. We further engage to watch over one another in brotherly love; to remember one another in prayer; to aid one another in sickness and distress; to cultivate Christian sympathy in feeling and courtesy in speech; to be slow to take offense, but always ready for reconciliation and mindful of the Word of our Savior to secure it without delay.
- 5. We moreover engage that when we remove from this place, we will, if possible, unite with a likeminded church where we can carry out the spirit of this covenant.

Article 6: Revisions, Additions and Amendments

Adoption -This Constitution shall be considered adopted and shall take place of all other Constitutions when three-fourths (3/4) members present and voting at a Business Conference shall vote in favor. Such vote shall take place after the Congregation has had ample time to read over, and review this Constitution.

Suspension, Amendments or Repeal - This Constitution may be altered, amended, or rescinded by the body of this Church at a Business Conference called for this sole purpose provided that proper notice has been given in writing at least 30 days prior to the Business Conference. Notice of any proposed amendments must be made in writing at least 30 days prior to the date of the consensus affirmation of the membership. During that period any member may express his conviction concerning the proposed amendment by submitting a written statement to the Pastor or Deacons for consideration. Any of these actions must receive an approval of three fourths (3/4) majority of members present and voting.
