"Send the Light"

One of the "Golden Oldie" church songs I sang since I was a little tot is called, "Send the Light." It was hymn # 261 in the old, blue "Great Songs of the Church" book. The first verse starts... "There's a call comes ringing o'er the restless wave; Send the Light..." The second verse starts... "We have heard the Macedonian Call today: Send the light... Send the light." So what in the world is the "Macedonian Call?" To get the entire story you have to read Acts 16. Paul is beginning his Second Missionary Journey and apparently Paul has his plan for how that trip should go...but God has another plan. So, part way through his trip, Paul has a vision and God redirects his path.

Go ahead, read the text! Paul has one plan, and God has a dramatically different plan. Who wins that battle? Paul submits, and God wins. Paul goes God's way and initially it does not end well. Paul ends up getting falsely accused, dragged into the city, stripped, beaten with rods and thrown into prison (Acts 16:19-25). "Following God" means that we frequently change our course of action. It also means that we take risks. I'm distressed by those modern day false preachers who teach that God has called you to be his child because He wants you to be successful and wealthy. God is more interested in us submitting to His will than He is in keeping us safe, successful and comfortable! God has bigger plans for us!

Because Paul followed God's path, and responded to the "Macedonian Call," the successful business woman, Lydia and her household, were baptized (Acts. 16:15), and their lives were forever changed. Because Paul followed God's path, the Philippian Jailer and his household were baptized (Acts 16:33), and their lives were forever changed. When we chose to follow God's vision, we will likely not be following the safe course, from a human perspective; but following God's call will take us places that we never intended to go and have us doing things that we never intended to do. When we follow God's vision, we partner with Him to change the course of history, and lives are forever changed.

When I moved my family to Luverne, Alabama after accepting the pulpit minister position with the church, my children were five and four years of age, respectively. A couple of afternoons a week I would take them with me as I went to visit some of our older members.

One afternoon, shortly after we had moved, we went to visit a family who lived out of town a few miles. It was a rural area. As a car traveling in the opposite direction would meet our car and pass us, I would raise the fingers of the hand on the steering wheel and wave. After seeing me do that three or four times, my daughter Amy, said, "Daddy, how do you know all of those people?" The truth was that I didn't know all of those people. It was just a way of saying, "Hi." That was just the way I was taught as I was a kid growing up in Louisiana.

I share that story to contrast it with the depth of relationships I can now have with people in my LIFE group. It is the difference between not knowing someone, but still saying "Hi" through a wave of my hand, and knowing someone deeply through sharing, caring, and praying with one another over time.

I am excited about LIFE groups beginning again in a few short weeks. It will be an opportunity to get to know some folks better. To love them, to really care for them, to encourage them, and support them in whatever they are going through in their lives. On the other hand, it will be an opportunity for me to be loved, encouraged, and supported by them, also. And it is an opportunity for us to be able to pray for one another weekly.

All of that is pretty awesome! I am looking forward to it. What about you?

New Fiscal Year

Two weeks ago, Dave Perine made his annual church budget presentation to the congregation. Although the 2014-15 fiscal year budget shows an increase of 8% over last year's budget, the increase over last year's actual giving is only 4%, or approximately \$400 per week. To put this in perspective, Dave shared that \$400 per week represents an increase of only \$3 per week for each family in the congregation. Increased usage of our building for Family Promise and other activities is a major contributor to the budget increase. Copies of the budget are available in Dottie's office. If you have questions, feel free to contact Dave or one of the other elders.

<u>Transparency:</u> I am thrilled to report that our church is all about transparency and accountability. Our fiscal year runs July 1 - June 30. While the average increase per family is \$3 per week, not all will be able to increase at this time, so some of us will need to do more! **-Dan**

A couple of weeks ago I went to see my grand-daughter perform with the Summer Youth Band at Sunset Auditorium in Pitman. There were kids representing over 30 schools and their parents attending. It was a great concert.

Three quarters of the way through the concert one of the members of the Hobo Band thanked those who worked with the children and those who made this event possible. The gentleman speaking said there were more things in the works for our teens, but he was not at liberty to say what they were.
