Reflections on Today's Message

Nehemiah faced considerable adversity and cunning adversaries while leading the rebuilding of the approximately two-mile long Jerusalem wall. In today's *Build Well* message, we'll explore three questions: What did these adversaries do? What was the effect of their opposition? How did Nehemiah deal with his opponents? To know Nehemiah's strategies will help us, not only when we face opposition, but in carrying out our congregational mission.
